





4-CHAIRMAN of the BOARDS' REPORT.

Welcome to the 2022 AGM and to my first Chair/President's report. 2021 and 2022 saw Rowing Tas dealing with Covid, site security, masks, generally no camping and the other complications of a pandemic. Thank you to all schools and clubs for your diligence. RT has had a busy season, with record seat numbers at some regattas, but low numbers at Regattas 4 and 5.

In June this year we witnessed the destruction of the start pontoon, electrical equipment, and broken buoy lines. This is going to a monumental effort by Mick, George, and the crew to get things back together. Alas, the likely hood of the new starting pontoon built in the upcoming season is unlikely.

I also accepted the resignation of Reg Mauderer from the Board. Reg's term was up this year, he considered standing again, but due to personal reasons he was unable to dedicate the serious time that is required to fulfill the role. In doing so, it highlights the need for participants in the sport to be prepared to step up and that representation of the RT Board preferably be in the 50% gender split. This is now a normal requirement of doing business in our and other sporting activities, and this should not be difficult to achieve.

Volunteers, thank you for all the great work you do, as a 'sport' we are so reliant on you all, but we need new bodies. The average age of our volunteer base is in the 60's. So, if you are bored sitting on the bank or have that spirit, please tap any of the volunteers on the shoulder and join the crew.

In July RT held the first Forums in Campbell Town, which was well attended by the affiliate clubs and school rowing coordinators, Questions were put in place prior to the Forum so all concerned had adequate and in-depth answers. I believe that the outcome was beneficial and most walked away feeling the positive outcomes were achieved. Plans will be put in place for next year for another club and school

Our CEO Rob Prescott has been hard at the wheel all year, I would like to thank him for his tireless work and extraordinary length he goes to, to make sure things are in place. As you are all aware, RT is not a small organisation, and we are push from all sides to make sure we are compliant, licenced, and masked!

As you know there are vacancies on the board, but also, we are losing our financial director John Oliver, who has been steering RTAS through the minefield of best practice accountability for our funds, thank you.

6-CEO Report.

In the second year of the pandemic, we as a sport can take many positives from it with a full season of competition, apart from not holding State Club Regatta Five in January, we have seen very strong participation numbers in both Club and School Regattas. It was pleasing to see that the club events, NERC Long Distance races, Sandy Bay Regatta, Royal Hobart and NNRC Long distance events were also conducted and there was the two Junior Quad Regattas conducted on the Tamar and at New Norfolk, thank you to the Tamar Rowing Club and New Norfolk Rowing Club for hosting these events. It was disappointing that the Launceston and Henley Regatta could not be rowed, and again thanks to Tamar who stepped in, along with a small group of volunteers and the Launceston on Tamar Regatta was held.

Governance.

The Board of Rowing Tasmania has meet eight times in the last twelve months either virtually or face to face with an attendance rate of 97%. I would like to thank the Board for the many voluntary hours that they have given to the sport over the last twelve months.

Rowing Tasmania Staff Members and Contractors.

Beverly Smith has joined us looking after Accounts and has taken a very strong and personal interest in taking the backend of Rowing Tasmania to another level and I look forward to seeing what will be achieved over the next twelve months in this area.

Letitia Smith has taken over the role of our cleaner and with her strong knowledge in the commercial cleaning this will only continue to improve what we offer at the Lake.

Steven May continues to improve the surrounds of the Lake as our groundsman and along with Tish, they are the faces of Lake Barrington, greeting our guests who hire the facilities.

Coffee is an integral part of the offering at the Lake and with Andrea Sulcs, Meg Lyall and Sophie Souris making the finest coffee on the Lake we are fortunate to have them as part of our team.

The Easy Oar Canteen has enjoyed a very successful season with solid growth and again has proven to be a very successful fund raising area for the Clubs and Schools with again \$25,000 returned back to the rowing community. On behalf of Rowing Tasmania and the patrons I would like to thank all the members of the clubs and schools who worked shifts in the Canteen, your efforts are very much appreciated by all.

I would also like to thank Carmen, as our Catering Manager there are many hours spent not only collaborating with the volunteers but also the behind-the-scenes tasks that extend well outside her contracted hours

Conclusion.

To the teams at Aintree Contracting, LINK Hire, The Hub, AON Insurance, Communities Sport and Recreation, the Tasmanian Institute of Sport, Events Tasmania, the Mayor and staff at the Kentish Council, Hydro Tasmania, Marine and Safety Tasmania and our Parks and Wildlife rangers, thank you for your input and assistance during the year.

The technical side of our regattas is top of mind to one of our volunteers Fred Slamen who goes about improving and adding to all things electronic and I thank him for all that he contributes.

As a sport rowing is in a very strong and enviable position in Tasmania with so many positive facets to it, including a vibrant and strong regatta calendar, a secure financial position, both schools and clubs offering people the opportunity to be involved both on and off the water, a dedicated and committed Board, engaging Commissions and Working Groups and one of the many jewels in our crown, the Lake Barrington International Rowing Centre.

In conclusion I would like to extend my personal thanks to the rowing community for the cooperation that was shown by being "Covid-Compliant" at each of our regattas. As part of the conditions set by Public Health our venue was inspected by Government personal and each of the following regattas were conditional on what was found at each inspection. Collectively we passed and were complemented on what was in place from the clubs and schools Covid Management Plans, the wearing of masks and the attitude of the rowing community.

7-Regatta's Managers Report-Club.

A fantastic season with entries high, especially in the second half of the season. Four regattas, SP3 – SP4 – SP6 – Championships had the highest attendance for comparative regattas over recent years, probably ever. SP4 and SP6 were the highest attended regattas of any for many years. The entry total for SP6 of 2569 will take some beating. Very little racing was lost due to weather. The sport had a very successful season, which could have resulted a little from the Covid outbreak in early 2020. Many sports were interrupted, or lost completely, so it is possible that athletes in general were excited by the full and normal rowing season. Rowing may have benefited greatly from its timing within the year. It will be interesting if next season follows that trend, or changes yet again.

One issue which arose from the high entry rates was the length of the regattas. Yes the numbers were up, but the shrinking numbers of officials meant that sometimes the gaps between races had to be slightly longer than optimum. There is no doubt that there is a need to "attract" more helpers to optimise the timing for regattas.

The "pathway" established for rowers, namely U17-U19-U21-Senior seems to be working well. Numbers definitely increased in the U21 group. Some rearrangement of 8's races, especially for the Senior Men and Women seemed to be met with approval.

The IT environment continued to develop considerably throughout the season thanks to the indefatigable efforts of Fred Slamen who continued to make it a personal project. The transfer of results from the Finish tower to the Office became significantly more reliable. With the spectre of National Championships on the horizon the results system worked perfectly.

The continued support of the Ulverstone Scouting group in manning and womaning the boat-holding at the start is greatly appreciated. Rain or shine, they were there doing their bit – a great effort. The club support of the rostering of other jobs – boat driving and numbers – has also become very efficient with volunteers coming forward at all times. This is a critical task, and the regatta cannot proceed without this support. The assistance of Peter George in organising the boat driving roster is greatly appreciated.

The Regatta Management database – rp7 – continues to be an extremely efficient regatta organiser which enables all the paperwork to be achieved efficiently and quickly. Regatta manager has developed a basic regatta "score" for rating rowers, but it is still slightly short of the mark as it takes each race as self-standing. This fails to account for weather variations. I still hope this can be addressed in the future.

Finally, thanks again to the many hours provided by the on-water Boat Officials and Referees and to the many people giving time to help in the Office. The time provided by all the volunteers helps the Regattas run as smoothly as they do. A regatta would simply not happen without the support and generous offer of time from these people. In addition, as all our regattas are now managed by Rowing Manager and rp7, a number of other volunteers have up skilled in the office so that they are available for other non-pennant regattas such as Schools regattas and Masters regattas.

Tas Uni took a tight grip on the Pennant early in the season, though Bucks kept the pressure on for the Hydro Cup right to the end. A great showing by New Norfolk and Mersey clubs who both had good overall seasons. Grammar sowed the way in the Schools Cup, closely followed by Scotch.

8-Regatta Managers Report-Schools

As with the club regatta series, we were fortunate to be able to successfully conduct the full school's regatta program. The school season opener, the Junior Sculling Camp and Regatta at Lake Barrington was, again, very successful, and the confidence, boat skills and competition understanding of the participating rowers showed in subsequent regattas.

Site constraints at Franklin in a Covid 19 world did require revision to the format of the Schools Regatta One, with the Schoolgirls' events held on Saturday 6th February and Schoolboys' events on Sunday 7th. Bad weather did result in a number of events being curtailed, and with senior events limited and the program shortened.

The significant increase in competitors and seat numbers did result in long sessions, particularly for Schools Regatta Two and the Saturday heats at the Schools' Championship Regatta. As with the Club Pennant series, this again put considerable strain on Boat Race Officials.

At the North-West Schools' Regatta, The Friends School won both the Junior and Overall Schoolgirls' trophies, with St Virgils College winning the Junior Schoolboys' and Scotch-Oakburn College winning the Overall Schoolboys' trophy.

In the School Championships Regatta, The Friends' School again won both the Junior and Overall Schoolgirls trophies, while in the Schoolboys events St Virgils College won the Junior Aggregate and The Hutchins School the Overall Schoolboys' Trophy.

I advise Rachel Kitson and Mick Casey are elected to the Board.

Before this matter is closed, I wish to provide further comment as this is the second year that the Board has received an invalid nomination form.

For those not aware, Clause 15.2 of the Constitution sets out the requirement for a nomination. In summary the requirement is:

- 1. A nomination must be submitted on the Rowing Tas nomination form.
- 2. The form must be signed by two members who have been elected to serve on a Cub's Committee/Board: and
- 3. Signed by the nominee accepting the nomination
- 4. Lastly, the completed form must be delivered no later than the closing date.

The nominations were invalid because the nomination form was not signed by two members of the Club's Committee/Board.

This contrasts with the previous Constitution where a nomination could be signed by any two members registered with Rowing Tasmania."

The Chairman, James Gibson OAM thanked the two retiring members, Meaghan Volker, and Peter George for their services on the Board and their contribution to the sport of rowing
